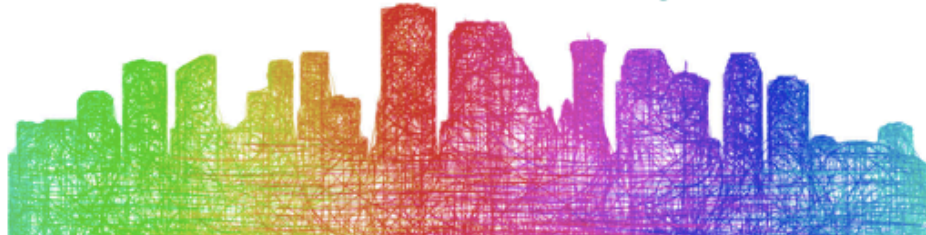

<p>Train the Trainer (*OSC)</p> <p>Train the Trainer is a didactic and hands-on course designed to enable participants to bring in-situ low fidelity simulation to their own L+D units. The focus is on providing the participant with tools to improve team communication while removing site specific barriers to effective response to emergencies. Once finished with this course, the participant will have a framework to develop and run multidisciplinary scenarios for unit specific needs for maintenance and acquisition of skills. Specific objectives include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Understand how the teamwork principles of leadership, situational awareness, mutual support and communication can improve patient safety 2.
